To all members of the Nelson Marlborough Branch of the Institute of Directors in New Zealand (Inc):

On behalf of the Nelson Marlborough branch committee, it is my pleasure to report on the 2022 year. It has been another year with periods of uncertainty for many businesses and for the branch here. The impact of COVID-19 finally sweeping our community earlier this year meant that we were constrained from delivering our in-person events locally. While we remain in good heart, we look forward to a year ahead in 2023 of re-building our in-persona education and networking events.

Our branch's key objectives for 2022 were;
