Director independence: IoD submission on NZX consultation paper

This submission responds to the May 2023 NZX Director Independence Consultation Paper and the specific questions posed.

Overall, we support boards having independent directors on boards, see qualified and capable directors generally as important for high functioning boards and caution against too much precision in the specification of independence.

The latter is because of mixed evidence on the impact of director independence on firm strategy, operations and short and longer-term financial performance. Much of this is situation and circumstance specific, and is dependent on where and when the research was undertaken, jurisdictional differences, and ongoing changes in legislation, rules and codes, including on the definition of and approach to director independence.

We also note that director independence is one issue among a suite of matters that have to be considered including:

- Board appointment processes.
- Wider management and disclosure of interests and conflicts.
- Extent and nature of shareholders and their shareholdings.
